apprehensions; convict returns; disciplining of police; escapees and absconders from custody; housebreakers and burglars; licensed carriers, hawkers, oyster fishers, and tanners; deserting wives, families, etc; deserting from military service; deserting from merchant vessels; inquests; missing friends; murderers and their victims; police resignations; prisoners discharged from gaols; prisoners released on tickets of leave; property and stock recovered; rewards - names of persons offering a reward; victims of arson; victims of horse and cattle stealing or straying; victims of lost or stolen property; victims of sheep stealing or straying". -- Cover.
