

Indigenous Language Wordlists Duungidjawu Body Parts

Duungidjawu is the name of one of the languages spoken in the Upper Brisbane River Catchment, extending from Caboolture to Moore. There are shared words between Duungidjawu and neighbouring languages of Kabi Kabi to the East and Wakka Wakka to the West and North.

Much of what we know about Duungidjawu has been provided by Uncle Willie McKenzie, also known as Gaiarbau. L P Winterbotham interviewed Gaiarbau in the 1950's and his manuscript provided valuable cultural knowledge on Duungidjawu and neighbouring groups in the region.

As Aboriginal languages were oral-based, the spelling of Duungidjawu and Duungidjawu language may be differ in historical document and other sources; for example Duungidjawu has also been spelt djunggidjau, dungidau, dungidjau and dunggija.

The following list identifies parts of the body and their suggested pronunciation.

Note: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages were oral-based; there may be several variations in spelling and pronunciation. The following list should be seen as a guide - check with local language speakers as to the preferred local pronunciation.
