## ***Index to Griffith's valuation of Ireland 1848-1864***

This CD-ROM is an Index of Surnames of Householders in Griffith's Primary Valuation (a 19th century Irish census substitute). It contains information about an individual, including the county, parish, and location in which the individual resided at the time of the valuation. There may also be information such as occupation or family trade, the name of the family dwelling, skills associated with the individual, religious affiliation, or physical or moral characteristics of the individual or that person's ancestors. From this index you can view the microfiche copy of the Griffith's Valuation, which the State Library holds.

## ***Index to the Irish marriages (Farrar's Irish marriages) 1771-1812*** / Henry Farrar

This CD-ROM contains high quality scanned images of the original book. It has been bookmarked for easy navigation, and pages can be searched, browsed, enlarged and printed out if required. This index by Henry Farrar, published in two volumes in 1897, details all the marriage entries in Walker's Hibernian Magazine 1771-1812. There are over 12,000 marriages recorded from a time when few other records of this nature survive.

## ***Index to the Marriage License Bonds of the Diocese of Cloyne Ireland for the years from 1630 to 1800 : preserved in the Public Record Office of Ireland***

Over 9,000 marriage licence bonds prior to 1800 from the Diocese of Cloyne have been indexed here as part of a project to index all the marriage licence bonds for the entire county of Cork. Bishops required couples to enter into a Bond before granting a licence for a marriage as an insurance against potential legal action if there were some impediment to the union (e.g. a prior contract). It was also easier for couples who did not wish to have to go through the usual Banns, whereby a notice of the marriage would have to be publicised for three weeks or more before the intended date of marriage. These are important in the absence of parish registers.

## ***Irish flax growers, 1796 (International land records)***

This list, published by the Irish Linen Board, records details of nearly 60,000 people who received grants for planting flax; it gives the full name of each person, and also the civil parish and county in which the flax was grown. This is an important source of information, since little survives in the way of nineteenth century Irish census records.

## ***The Irish genealogist: volumes 1-8, 1937-1993***

The Official Organ of the Irish Genealogical Research Society was first published in April 1937. This publication covers from that very first issue up to Volume 8 in 1993. It covers such diverse topics as family registers, abstracts of Diocesan Wills, monumental inscriptions, many important family genealogies, guides for those wishing to do their own genealogical research, as well as Ken Nicholls standard setting work on the Kavanaghs (1400-1700). These and much more are covered in over 5,000 pages of invaluable material, compiled in an easy to use and search format, using scans of the original volumes. It is accompanied by a booklet.

## ***Parliamentary Gazetteer of Ireland 1846***

This CD-ROM contains high quality scanned images of the original book. The Parliamentary Gazetteer of Ireland was published in Dublin, London and Edinburgh by A. Fullerton & Co., in 1846 and remains the only parliamentary gazetteer that wholly covers the thirty-two counties of Ireland. It happily combines statistical, topographical and anecdotal material on many of Ireland's smaller villages and hamlets as well as the country's larger towns and cities. It takes information from the statistics of the 1831 and 1841 Censuses of Ireland. It touches on the cities, civil parishes and main post towns of Ireland, as well as on minor geographical features, such as small streams and man-made structures, such as bridges, harbours and ferries; some of the latter were only in their developmental stages and never actually came to fruition.

Additional information contained also includes the deliberations of ministers, elders, baillies and incorporations, concerning the church, churchyard, schools, the poor, the errant men and women of the parish and the religious and social evolution of the people.
