School term kicks off

The great home-learning experiment begins. If you have school-aged children, we hope your day went as smoothly as possible under the circumstances.

State Library is offering support to all Queensland students and teachers with the launch of <u>Learning from home</u> and <u>Reading Adventure Club</u>.

On Friday we provided the <u>Employment Arrangements for School Operations Term 2 –</u> <u>Home-based learning model guidelines</u>, to provide clarity for staff with school-aged children. Key points:

- All paid employment, at your usual workplace or working from home, is considered essential work.
- Properly supervised school-aged children should be kept at home if possible.
- Parents and carers are best placed to decide if safe supervision is possible.
- If a child cannot stay at home, then supervision at the school is available. Parents are strongly encouraged to talk to the school principal if they have any concerns.
- To balance work and carer responsibilities, there is flexibility around start and finish times if you are a parent or carer working from home.
- A working from home parent or carer may access leave if required, including for partdays. This includes TOIL, accrued time, carer's leave, annual leave and long service leave.
