\$347,465 in grants for Queensland public libraries

A rugby league star who champions literacy, a travelling pop-up library and singing sessions at a local pool are just some of the innovative public library initiatives to benefit from \$347,465 in State Government grants.

The grant package has been awarded through State Library of Queensland's First 5 Forever Innovation and Community Literacy Champions grants, enabling 20 Queensland councils to roll out localised programs, services or campaigns to support families with young children (aged 0-5).

Eighteen councils will be offered a share of \$284,465 for First 5 Forever Project Grants. The grants support initiatives that promote stronger language and early literacy environments for local families. An additional \$63,000 will be shared between five councils to engage local champions to raise awareness of the importance of early literacy among their communities.

The grants are part of \$5 million in State Government funding provided to councils each year to deliver the First 5 Forever early literacy program in libraries across the state.

Grant highlights:

- \$8,932 for **Scenic Rim Council** to engage a rugby league personality to promote the importance of early literacy at local football matches
- \$16,910 for **Whitsunday Regional Council** to partner with the local PCYC on a "Early literacy is everybody's business' campaign
- \$26,564 for **Moreton Bay Regional Council** to launch a "My First Library Card" initiative partnering with local hospitals to target new parents and encourage them to access free early literacy support at the library
- \$12,762 for **Somerset Regional Council** to purchase a pop-up library trailer to travel the region and promote the importance early literacy to geographically remote families
- \$9,916 for **Tableland Libraries** to provide free early literacy 'Splash and Sing' sessions at the Atherton pool.
