State Library announces 2022 Young Writers Award winner

A heartbreaking tale of love, divorce and memory loss has won State Library of Queensland's 2022 Young Writers Award.

Callum Brocket, from Camp Hill in Brisbane, was awarded the \$2,000 prize for 'Once/Now' which will be published in *Griffith Review*.

This is the 25th Young Writers Award which has been the launchpad for well-known Australian authors such as Miles Franklin Award winner Tara June Winch, Benjamin Law, Shastra Deo, Rebecca Jessen and Christopher Currie.

The annual Young Writers Award is presented in partnership with *Griffith Review* and is open to Queenslanders aged 18 to 25.

The judges said Callum's story about an enduring love amid illness was ambitious and "it did not shy away from difficult subjects, and its themes are ones that are often hard for even seasoned writers to convey."

"But it met this complexity with a simple, beautiful handling of tone and an elegant structure."

First runner-up Ellie Kaddatz, 23, Newmarket, Brisbane, was awarded \$500 for her short story, 'Back Burning', which judges said invoked "that yearning that comes with growing up, young love, the possibilities of new lives and the questions left behind in the old."

The judges said the shortlist "proved once again the strength of young writers and what a privilege it is to read them."

"The writers selected this year showed a remarkable handling of language — emotive throughout but spare when it needed to be — and a great understanding of the craft of short fiction," the panel said.
