





My People





I love my Nanna Rose.






I have heaps of Aunties and Uncles, but too many to name.

I have so many cousins.


Kowie, he is the oldest of us all and he loves fishing.

Cam, she lives with me and is like my big sister. She helps me do my hair in the morning.






Nennox and Dill, they are my two favourites because they share their Iollies with me.


