

What was behind it? Sometimes, she walked down to the river. Where did it go?


She did not expect she would ever find out.

Until one day ...











Matilda paddled frantically in the **rushing**, **splushing**, **hustling** water.

The mass of waterweed bobbed on through the night.


Matilda was afraid to go to sleep. And she was very hungry.
